This booklet contains all the scholarships that I know about at this time. **Please do not stop your scholarship search with just these scholarships.** Many others do exist and I encourage you to contact colleges, clubs, place of employment and churches for additional opportunities. Feel free to contact the counseling office for additional information on these scholarships. Also, please share this information with your parents.

Each entry in the booklet contains the name and scholarship, the deadline for application, the approximate dollar value of the award and a brief description of the qualifications required.

Abbreviations are used often due to space limitations. Some of the more common ones used for individual colleges are as follows:

ISU - Iowa State University
SCC - Southeastern Community College
U of I - University of Iowa
UNI - University of Northern Iowa
WIU - Western Illinois University

The scholarships are arranged alphabetically in a horizontal direction across the page.

Deadlines are often based on information from last year as many organizations or schools have not yet sent applications with deadlines for this year. Some deadlines may have passed. Those have been previously announced and applications distributed to interested students.

In most cases, deadlines are the same or nearly the same as in previous years. Do not wait until the last minute to check on applications. They usually arrive about two months prior to deadline for applying. I will try to announce the arrival of applications on the daily announcements and the web site.

Remember, to receive a scholarship you must apply!!
